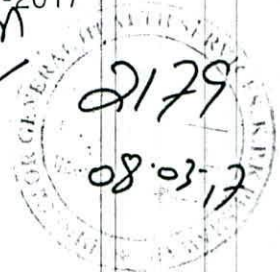

Australia Awards Scholarships Profile 1

Public Practitioners

Within federal and provincial government agencies, this category of Scholarship seeks to increase the application of appropriate policy, practice and resource allocation in the priority sectors.

Profile-specific Eligibility Criteria:

This category targets applicants who are employed in public institutions at the Federal or Provincial levels and who are working within one of the priority sectors of (i) public health (limited to public health and nutrition), (ii) education (including early childhood, basic and higher education), (iii) economic growth (including agriculture and rural development, international trade and economics, mining, water resources management and business management), (iv) good governance and stabilization, and (v) gender equality.

This includes applicants who are mid-level Government employees who can demonstrate the potential to influence policy, or who are practitioners working, facilitating or delivering services in one of the priority sectors.

At the completion of their studies, scholars identified with potential ability to influence policy making will return to key positions where they will be able to influence reform in the priority sector they have specialised in.

At least 50 percent of the Awards are allocated to public sector professionals.

Applications from eligible women, people living with disability, and ethnic minorities are strongly encouraged. At least 50 percent of the Awards will be given to women.

Candidates must:

- be an employee of a Federal or Provincial Ministry working in a priority sector.
- be able to provide a No Objection Certificate to take up the scholarship in January 2018, from their employer.
- be applying for a course that is relevant to one of the priority sectors.
- meet the minimum eligibility criteria and submit a personal statement.
- have a minimum of five years relevant work experience in the public sector.
- have achieved the minimum IELTS or TOEFL scores.

Australian universities have an obligation to provide students with disabilities reasonable adjustments to support their academic endeavours, such as additional training and/or access to assistive technology. Australia Awards will provide 'non-academic' reasonable adjustments to ensure that awardees with disability are adequately mobilised and supported, and have a positive experience in Australia.
